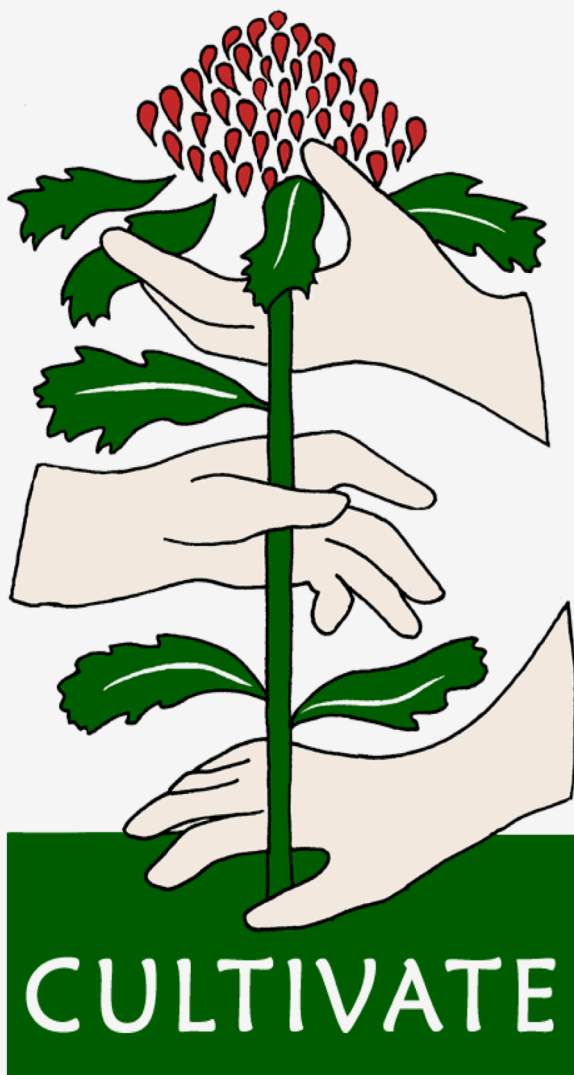


# Horticultural Therapy Course
